

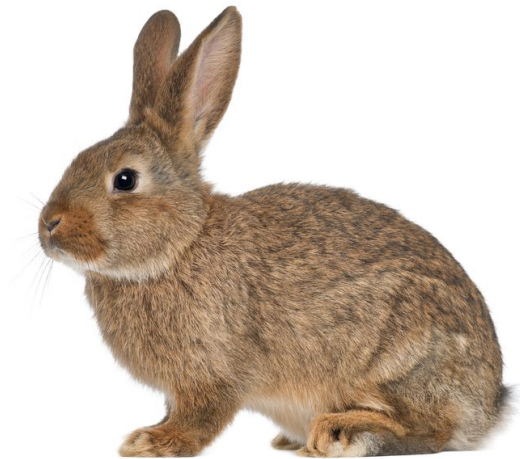

WEEKLY VOCABULARY: Say each word and ask the class to repeat after you three times. Emphasize final consonant sounds such as T and D. Translate each word into the closest Thai equivalent using a dictionary app on your phone. Now walk around the room and ask each student to repeat it until their pronunciation is satisfactory. Randomly ask students what the word means in Thai. When you're finished say the word again and ask the class to repeat after you three more times.
