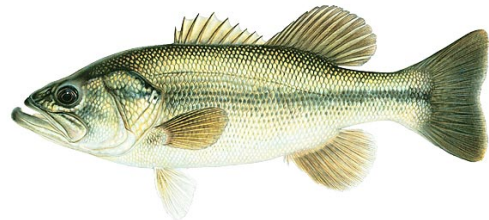

VOCABULARY GAME: Ask two students to go to the board and get ready to write. Go to the back of the room and ask a third student to pick a word from today's lesson. Call out the word and see who can write it correctly first. Now ask the first two students to pick two more students for the next round. You can divide the students into two teams to make this more competitive.

GRAMMAR: In this exercise we will introduce some irregular plural nouns. Explain that almost all nouns form plurals simply by adding an S but in some cases the plural is a separate word. You don't have to use the word "noun" or "plural" - just show examples.

Most words are easy – just add an S.

1. One fan → Two fans
2. One father → Two fathers
3. One friend → Two friends
4. One finger → Two fingers
5. One fish → Two fishes

Some words are not easy – you must use a different word.

1. One child → Two children
2. One foot → Two feet
3. One man → Two men
4. One mouse → Two mice
5. One tooth → Two teeth
