Two Tongue Twisters

- Are you going to the market in the car?
- The dog likes to bark at a car in the dark.



NOTES:

R is probably the most difficult consonant for Thai speakers to pronounce correctly. They will often substitute L for R. The Thai language does contain some R words, such as reo (fast) and rua (boat). Note that there are at least two ways to pronounce R sounds in English: “ra” / “re”, and “er” / “ar”. We will cover words with “ra” first. Other AR words: Army

The word “very” uses both V and R, so it is difficult to pronounce. We will cover “br” “cr” “dr” in the next course, CA.102.
